The RMYC provides students in years 8-12 with opportunities to learn about the environment in a hands-on way, to attend field trips and conferences, to have their voices heard on environmental issues and is a great way for students to meet some fantastic like-minded people and to have fun whilst making a real difference. There is an Upper Murray branch based out of Berri, and the Lower Murray Group is based at Murray Bridge.



Some of the activities planned for the year include a Headwaters Trip through the Murray-Darling Basin to learn the issues facing the basin and what's being done about them, to meet students along the way and share views on the River and the proposed Basin plan and to gain an appreciation of the Basin's scale and unique beauty, as well as participating in local revegetation programs, attending and presenting at the International River Health Conference in Melbourne in October, undertaking on-ground action at school, learning how to be environmental leaders through the SA Youth Environment Council and much more.

Meetings are held every 4-6 weeks from 4.30pm – 6.30pm. There will be an **information session next Monday the 13th of February, from 4.30 – 6.30 at Swanport Wetland, Murray Bridge** for the Lower Murray and one on **Wednesday the 22nd of February from 4.30-6.30pm at the SAMDBNRM Board office in Berri** for the Upper Murray group. It's a great opportunity to find out more about the program and meet some of the fantastic people involved in the council.

I'd also like to take this opportunity to draw on people's knowledge of the region and ask if anyone knows of any sites, people or experiences that would provide for good learning opportunities for the students on their Headwaters trip? Any suggestions would be most appreciated!

We have found over the years that mentor support- including sharing knowledge, assisting with transport, keeping an eye out for good learning opportunities etc.- has provided wonderful opportunities for students that may not have otherwise been able to participate in such activities, and has enriched their experience immensely. We would eagerly welcome any new mentors to the role, and appreciate any level of involvement you are willing to offer to this passionate group of students.
